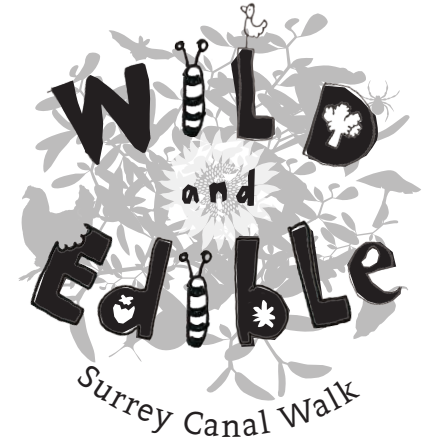

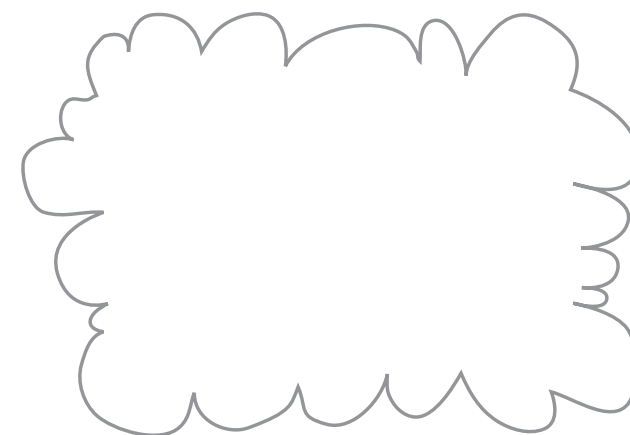
Have you spotted...



Blackberries provide cover for birds, invertebrates and foxes. The leaves provide food for some caterpillars. Nectar from the flowers attracts pollinators especially hover flies, butterflies and honey bees. The fruit is delicious and can be used in many ways. The fibrous stems can be split to use in place of string. It was used to bind the straw when making bee skeps. (J.M)

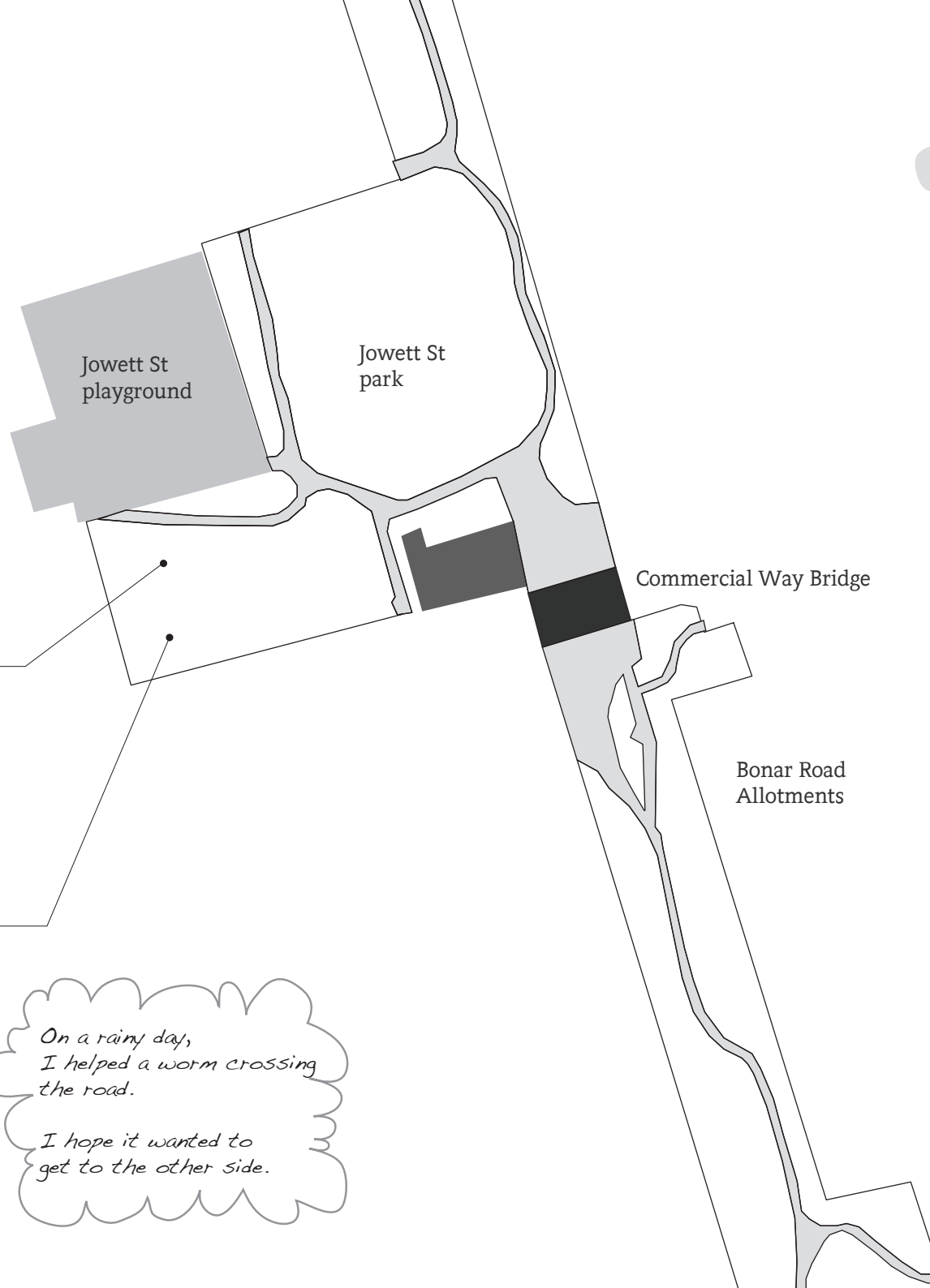
