BIG City Butterflies - An exciting new project for London!

Butterfly Conservation (BC) has been awarded Heritage Lottery funding to develop a pioneering project called 'Big City Butterflies'. This project will help Londoners discover butterflies and moths, connecting them to their local green spaces. The people we reach through this project will have opportunities to learn about how they can help butterflies and moths to thrive. Butterfly Conservation need help to make some important discoveries by asking Londoners to help us determine how populations of butterflies and moths in the capital are faring. Please join us in making London a great place for butterflies and moths!



Butterfly Conservation – who are we?

Butterfly Conservation is the UK charity dedicated to saving butterflies, moths and our environment. We are one of the largest insect conservation organisations in the world with more than 100,000 supporters and 15,000 volunteers.

We work to raise awareness of the plight of butterflies and moths by talking to people through our social media channels, by encouraging people to take part in our successful citizen science programmes and through our education projects.

BIG City Butterflies - our aims:

- To support Londoners to discover the rich butterfly and moth diversity in their local area and in doing so make a stronger connection with their local green spaces.
- To improve the quality and connectivity of green spaces in inner London to increase their suitability for species.
- To increase levels of recording and monitoring in London.
- To increase opportunities for BC to reach new audiences and form new partnerships.
- To enable BC to develop and test new approaches to conservation in urban spaces.



Join us

This year we are completing a 1 year development phase which will allow us to test and refine our plans. We will then submit a full application to the National Lottery Heritage Fund which, if successful, will mean a four year project in London, commencing 2020. We are keen to develop new partnerships with a range of organisations.
